## Thoughts from the soon to be Pastor... (Ordination is July 25, 2026)

### Keeping Our Eyes on Jesus

One of the greatest spiritual challenges we face is learning the difference between our responsibility and God's responsibility. As Christians, we care deeply about one another. We want what is best for our families, our friends, our church members, and our neighbors. We want people to make good decisions, grow in faith, avoid harmful choices, and experience God's blessings. But sometimes concern can quietly become control.

Fear can convince us that it is our job to manage another person's spiritual journey. We may feel compelled to correct, rescue, convince, supervise, or protect people from every possible mistake. We may begin carrying burdens that God never asked us to carry. When that happens, we often lose sight of our own spiritual condition.

Jesus said: "Why do you see the speck in your neighbor's eye, but do not notice the log in your own eye?" (Matthew 7:3)

Jesus is not telling us to ignore one another. He is reminding us that self-examination must come before judgment. Before we attempt to fix someone else, we are called to examine our own hearts. In recovery communities, there is a simple principle: "Keep your side of the street clean." That wisdom applies to Christian discipleship as well. We cannot do another person's praying, healing, repentance or growing. Every person must walk their own journey with God. Our role is not to play God. Our role is to love, encourage, pray, and bear witness to Christ.

Fear often tempts us to step beyond those boundaries. But... "What if they make a mistake?" "What if they get hurt?" "What if they don't listen?" "What if things don't turn out the way I think they should?". Those fears are understandable. They come from our desire for safety and certainty. Yet when fear becomes our guide, we can begin trying to control outcomes that belong to God.

The truth is that God loves the people we worry about even more than we do. God is already at work in their lives. The Holy Spirit is capable of guiding, correcting, convicting, and healing in ways that we cannot. When we try to take over God's role, we often become anxious, frustrated, resentful, or exhausted. We carry responsibilities that were never ours to carry.

The invitation of Christ is different. Jesus calls us to keep our eyes fixed on Him. To trust Him. To follow Him. To allow Him to be Lord of our lives and the lives of those we love. Healthy boundaries are not walls that separate us from others. They are acts of trust. They recognize where our responsibility ends and God's responsibility begins.

We are responsible for our attitudes, our words, our actions, our repentance, our prayer life, and our faithfulness. We are NOT responsible for controlling another person's choices, emotions, recovery, spiritual growth, or relationship with God. That does not mean we stop caring. It means we care in a healthier way.

At Augustana Lutheran Church, we believe that healing happens when people are given room to encounter God's grace for themselves. We walk alongside one another, but we do not walk for one another. The Church is not a place where people are forced into transformation. It is a place where Christ meets people through Word, Sacrament, community, and grace.

As we continue our journeys of recovery, renewal, and relationship, may we remember that our primary calling is not to fix others but to follow Jesus. And when fear tempts us to defend, control, or play God, may we hear Christ's gentle invitation: "Follow me."

# Recipe from the Church Kitchen

## Vegan Banana Cake

### Ingredients:

2 cups all-purpose flour  
1 ½ tsp baking soda  
½ tsp salt  
1 cup sugar  
¼ cup oil (vegetable, canola, or other neutral oil)  
4 ripe bananas (mashed)  
¼ cups water  
1 tsp vanilla extract

### Steps:

Preheat the oven to 350°F/175°C. Lightly grease a 9" square baking pan  
In a small bowl, whisk together the flour, baking soda, and salt. Set aside  
In a separate large bowl, whisk together the sugar and oil, then add in the mashed bananas until combined  
Add the water and vanilla, stirring to combine  
Add flour and baking soda mixture, stirring just until the ingredients are lightly mixed and thoroughly wet. Make sure not to over-mix  
Bake for 45–50 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean  
Remove the cake from the oven, place it on a wire rack, and let cool in the pan for 15 minutes. Turn it out of the pan onto the rack and let it cool completely before cutting into squares to serve

I usually make it in an 8" square pan and it works fine; for the wedding I made a double batch in a 9"×13" pan which seemed to work without issue, though it did need a few extra minutes in the oven.
